Corner



As you may be aware, the District Officers have been working with the Board of Commissioners to Update and re-establish our state Occupational Safety and Health (O.S.H.A.) requirements, as well as the National Fire Protection Association (N.F.P.A.) and Insurance providers recommendations. While the Officers researched modern and current information on Incident Management, the Board of Commissioners has contracted w/ Safety Management Solutions, Inc. to re-write the Occupational Safety and Health Policies and Trainings. Our hope is that these projects will be completed by the end of 2025. These Policies and Programs are specifically designed to protect all District Fire, EMS and Employees, from unnecessary harm in the workplace.

As part of this project, several manuals have been established to help inform and educate the Fire and EMS personnel. First is the District Incident Operations Programs, Procedures and Training Guidelines. This manual established Incident Operational Procedures as a guide to Officers and Firefighters alike to more effectively respond to and mitigate emergency incidents.



The manual is a "Living Document" which will be overseen by the District Officers and to be up to date on incidents and Procedures.

Secondly is the Districts Training Unit Programs, Policies and Training Guidelines. This manual(s) comprises information on District Training Office responsibilities, Training Evolutions, New Member Orientation and Training Bulletins which covers information on district equipment. As a new piece of equipment comes into service, a training procedure will be established. Our hope is for this manual to take some of the stress of developing drills and training on equipment off the Training Officers. We hope that soon, these manuals will be placed on the district's web site for members' use and review. If you have any comments or concerns, feel free to notify myself or any Board member.

Jr. FF of the month - Zachary Restorff - Hillcrest





Zach has been working hard in his training for the past year. One element that all first responders must learn in this line of work is what we call "making themselves comfortable

with the uncomfortable." Zach has certainly learned this and has continually demonstrated he has what it takes. Several months back I was contacted by a Cheektowaga Resource Officer that wanted to commend Zach on an incident that happened at Zach's high school several weeks back.

A fellow student had an issue and decided to put his arm through a glass display window severing an artery in his arm and showing significant blood loss. As one would imagine, the scene was chaos with several teachers afraid to engage and the Resource Officer trying to assist the patient while **Emergency Responders were** contacted to respond. Zach saw what was going on and immediately engaged the officer and asked to assist. Zach aided the officer by putting a tourniquet on the patient's arm to stop the bleeding and calm the student down.

The officer was incredibly impressed by the way Zach was able to stay calm in a chaotic circumstance and knew how to act. The patient was transported and survived the incident thanks to the quick work of the Resource Officer and Zach Restorff, Zach is a 3rd generation firefighter to come through Hillcrest being the son of Hillcrest firefighter Roger Restorff and grandson to Hillcrest firefighter George Slocum. Zach, while still attending high school, still finds the time to make 150 calls and 12 drills in 2024 and on pace to surpass that in 2025. Zach has become what we strive to find in the next generation of fire fighters coming up. This coming October Zach will turn 18 and will immediately be made a firefighter of the Hillcrest Fire Company. We look forward to watching Zach's development serving his community.

From the Desk of Chris Couell: District Fire Training Officer



- 1. The county has changed the application process for state courses. We have now added the state course number and a pre-filled Training Authorization Letter for each class to the County Fire Safety webpage. It is now mandatory that a TAL is provided for each student PRIOR to being officially enrolled in any state course and filed in the state Learning Management System (LMS). We are working closely with the state to make this an easy transition for our county firefighters. PLEASE USE THE STATE COURSE ID NUMBER ON THE TALs. If anyone needs assistance, please contact me. Chiefs, you will need to sign the TALs after approving that your firefighter is taking a class. This is due to having the students covered from the time they get in their car to go to their first class, to the time they return from the last class.
- 2. The June District drill will be Monday June 16th. We will be doing Live Fire training at Chestnut Ridge starting at 19:00.
- 3. I would like to congratulate Captain Steve Majstorovic from Orchard Park for completing the NYSAFC's training at the "Rock". That's the FDNY Training Academy in NYC. Steve did 2 days of intense Live Fire hands on training led by a cadre of FDNY Instructors. He did a total of 16 hours of Truck Company & Engine Company training. Steve is looking forward to sharing those skills with our district members at upcoming drills.
- 4. I want to congratulate the following Orchard Park Fire District members who completed the GRIT Self Survival weekend at Getzville this year. This 2-day training takes firefighters through brutal self-survival skills, and challenges them to the point of failure or success. We are proud to say our OPFD firefighters did a great job. 


